General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

Proposal to participate in a membership database trial for the Oxford Diocesan Guild

GDPR Consequences

- An organisation must:
 - Know what information they hold on both computers and paper
 - Ensure the information is accurate and up to date
 - · Know where the information is held
 - Know who has access to the information
 - Ensure the information is held securely (paper and computer)
 - Has Policies and Procedures in place
- AND

• Within 1 month of a request from an individual, provide a copy of ALL the data they hold on them.

GDPR Requirements

- Any organisation which holds personal information on individuals must comply with the GDPR requirements.
- In particular, an individual has the:
 - 1. Right to be informed of the data held
 - 2. Right of access to the data
 - 3. Right to rectification of the data
 - 4. Right to erasure of the data
 - 5. Right to restrict processing of the data
 - 6. Right to object

GDPR Compliance Solution

- Hold all membership information in one place, not with individuals
- Individuals are able to see, enter and make changes to their own information
- SOLUTION:
- Have an Online Membership Database for the Guild
 - Something the Guild has wanted for many years

- Both the Lincoln Guild and the Surrey Association have implemented Membership Databases
- Both use Membermojo.co.uk
- Membermojo is used by over 2000 clubs and societies
- Lincoln went live in January. Just handles membership.
- The Surrey Association does membership AND collects subscriptions paid by PayPal or credit/debit card
