

Chairman's Observations

Number of Sonning Deanery Branch Members – 176 (as per 2008 Guild Report)

Number of people who come to Branch Practices regularly – 8

That works out at only 4.5% of the branch membership regularly supporting the monthly Branch Practices.

Spiders

These days, many towers have a spider to draw the ropes up out of the way when they are not in use. Spiders come in all shapes and sizes — some are big and grand, with others little more than a few hooks on a block of wood.

On this year's branch outing, the spider at one tower drew particular comment as 'several coat hangers and a door knob'. It was indeed made out of coat hangers, but they were formed into gracefully curved hooks, all carefully made to be the same. The door knob was an old fashioned metal one, rather inelegantly tacked on underneath to give it enough weight to come down when empty. Sadly I didn't think to take a picture of it at the time, so you will have to imagine it.

I took pictures of several spiders on the previous year's outing though. Bats seemed to be in fashion in the area we visited — several towers had a bat hanging underneath the rope spider, like the one shown here. Another tower had a more ingenious design, which I liked most. It had a lurid green spider sitting in the middle of a web beneath what would otherwise have been a rather utilitarian affair of wood and pot hooks.

Nearer to home, the spider at All Saints Wokingham is unique, but quite different in style from these, with no attempt to mimic nature. It is cast aluminium, and if you look closely at the surface, you can see a granular structure, which gives a clue to how it was cast. A model of the spider, made of expanded polystyrene, was packed in foundry sand, and liquid aluminium poured in. As soon as the molten metal made contact with the polystyrene it vaporised, leaving its imprint in the sand as the mould for the metal. Look carefully at the eight legs' and you might recognise the shape of the little curly pieces of polystyrene that are often used to fill the space around delicate objects.

The Master presented the Striking Competition Certificates to all those that had taken part – representatives from Sonning were presented with their certificate for the 6 Bell Striking Competition. The other presentation to take place was the Young Ringers' Award. Three young ringers received this award (for more information on this contact John Harrison – Education Officer).

The most contentious issue of the AGM was the proposed rule change regarding Honorary Ringing Membership. Following a vote, where 58 were in favour of the change, 2 against and 2 abstained, Honorary Ringing Membership has been replaced by Distinguished Membership (See separate article).

A second rule change has made a change to the payment of subscriptions. If your subscription is unpaid by 31st March (previously 31st December) then your membership will cease until the subscription is paid.

Following the Guild AGM on 16th May the Honorary Ringing Membership no longer exists. Any current Honorary Ringing Members will keep their status.

Honorary Ringing Membership has been replaced by Distinguished Membership.

For a person to qualify for Distinguished Membership they must fulfil the following criteria:

- 1. Be a resident ringing member of the Guild for at least 30 years
- 2. Given meritorious service to the Guild or Branch

The procedure for this is as follows:

- 1. Proposal by 2 members of the Guild, with a citation to be sent to the General Secretary
- 2. The Guild Master, General Secretary and Deputy Guild Master will consider the proposals received.
- 3. If approved, the proposals will go forward to be ratified by the membership at the Guild AGM.

There will be a form available on the Guild Website to be completed should you wish to put anyone forward for this. Anyone who receives Distinguished Membership of the Guild will receive a certificate for this. Distinguished Members will still have to pay their annual subscription to the Guild.
