We asked people who rang the bells if they would like to attend a follow-up taster session with real tower bells. If they said 'yes', we got them to record their contact details on a paper form. Over the weekend we collected details of 30 people in total. Three of the people live in other Branches and I have passed their details to the Branch secretaries.

Six said they could definitely do the first taster session at Twyford the following Saturday morning (2nd July), and 6 more said they might be able to but would have to check their diaries. As secretary I contacted these people by email or telephone, and in the end we had five potential ringers who came to the taster session. This session went well, and all the participants said that they would like to continue to learn to ring. Two will be going to Twyford for initial training and three to All Saints Wokingham. Many thanks to the trainers and helpers at this taster session: John Harrison, Graham Slade, Vinni Sullivan, Nigel Mellor, Rob Needham and Pauline Needham.

This leaves about 20 people who may be interested in attending a second taster session at Twyford. So far the most likely date for the second taster session is the morning of Saturday 30th July at Twyford.

Of those who gave information about where they live, we have: Wokingham 8, Twyford 4, Hurst 3, Woodley 3, Winnersh 1, Ruscombe 1, (and 3 for Reading branch).

As part of the recruitment material for the Hurst Show, the Branch now has a smart, vinyl banner that displays all sorts of interesting facts about bell ringing. It is easy to put up and would grace any tower's open day or ringers recruitment exercise. A picture of it is on the branch website; please let me know if and when you want to use it.

Andrew Elliston 10.12.1944—24.05.2016

Andrew's kind heart and patience - all of us can recall a time when Andrew has helped out with a wedding, new learners or a quarter peal, even at short notice.

Andrew's dedication and loyalty to his friends and family. Again we as ringers we can recall many a time when Andrew made the difference to a practice night or a Branch Practice.

He touched many lives and will be missed so much. Our thoughts are with Pam and his children, David & Vicky.
