Chairman's message



It seems a long time since I wrote in the last newsletter as we were just emerging from the fourth wave of Covid, winding up practices and hoping we wouldn't be struck by too many more waves. As I write we seem to be entering the next wave, though it appears to be less disruptive than previous waves, and most people seem to be relaxing, now that most restrictions in society have been removed.

All our regular practices are now running again, and whereas initially we just concentrated on a couple of open ground floor rings we are now moving some of them to other towers round the Branch. Most have been well supported but a few

could have benefitted from more ringers, so please look to see which events would be best for you and support them. All members are welcome at Branch events but if you haven't been to one before, why not get someone else from your tower to go with you (or if you have been, encourage someone who hasn't). We've also started running courses in the Branch. In February eleven members attended a course on tower maintenance run for us by the Guild. By the time you read this we will also have run a course on rope splicing, and have arranged a course on listening skills, both of which were in high demand.

Jane, out Training Officer, is arranging an ART M2F course (teaching core skills) in October. Please contact her if you are interested at: training@sdb.odg.org.uk She has also identified the need for some skills training and has organised special practices.

We can organise more courses on topics for which there is demand, so we need to know what members want. The last time we asked for expressions of interest was in 2018, four years ago, and before Covid we ran 11 courses on the most popular topics. Many people's needs have changed in four years, so why not look at courses we have offered, and tell us which interest you. Most of our towers need to recruit, and I'm pleased to see that several have gained ringers who, after not ringing for some years, have now returned to ringing. They are the best sort of recruits, because neither they nor the band they join have to wait for a lengthy training process before they can get on and make a contribution. It has been said that there are more lapsed ringers than active ringers. I don't know whether that's true but there must be a lot. All we need to do is find them, and stimulate their interest.

The Platinum Jubilee gave us a chance to make a joyful noise as part of the nation's celebrations, and I was pleased to see many performances across the Branch, despite a lot of ringers being away. A total of 19 performances over the weekend, involving 10 towers, were reported on BellBoard.

Many of us will go away over the summer. I hope, like me, you will check to see what ringing there is near where you will be. Visitors are always welcome, especially during the summer when the 'home team' may be depleted by ringers being away, and it gives you a chance to ring at a new tower.

Towers and Belfries Maintenance Course - Twyford, 19 February 2022

Eleven keen students, with Tony Crabtree, Anthony Williamson and Len Palfrey, spent a very informative and practical day at St Mary's church, Twyford. The group comprised nine ringers, as well as two partners who are not ringers themselves but are keen to assist with maintenance.

The day started with presentations by Tony, Len and Anthony, setting out the programme for the day, giving health and safety guidance, and providing a background to problems that we might encounter, and ideas for improvements. We were also provided with copies of Anthony's very comprehensive checklist and schedule for tower inspections.

The whole group went up into the tower either to observe and listen, or to ring the bells (and ring them down again) ahead of the belfry visits, to get a feel for any potential problems.

We were then divided into groups to inspect the bells, using Anthony's checklist; to look at the bell model, together with headstock and clapper, and examples of wear and tear on stays, pulleys, bearings and other bell gear, with Len; and to learn how best to correct odd-struckness on the wheel, as well as helpful advice for putting on a new rope, with Tony.

We all learned a great deal during a very busy and enjoyable day, and as a result at least one tower has now had a full inspection, including the tightening of a couple of stay bolts and a new rope on one bell.

Huge thanks and appreciation to Tony, Anthony and Len, and to Simon Farrar, the tower captain at Twyford; see you in a tower somewhere soon!


The Sonning Scarecrow Trail was also held over the same weekend, and Sonning bell ringers took part by making and displaying a huge banner hung down the side of the tower.
