# Chairman's message



A lot of Branch activity is more or less back to the pre-Covid normal. Let's hope that we can weather the inevitable winter rise in cases without too much disruption.

The elementary practices we introduced a few years ago are clearly meeting a strong need, with good attendances and enthusiastic participants. To meet the demand our Ringing Master, Nigel, has increased them from once to twice a month. I'm pleased also that our new Youth Officer, Jennifer, has been able to restart Young Ringers Practices.

Branch events on weekday evenings are hard for anyone whose home tower practises on the same night to attend. To get round this, at least in part, we will be alternating both

Elementary and Advanced practices between Tuesday and Wednesday.

On another positive note we must congratulate our training Officer, Jane, for taking the initiative to host an ART course on teaching foundation skills. Nine Branch members were on the course – a significant boost to teaching skills within the Branch.

It was sad to be ringing for the Queen's death just three months after ringing for her Platinum Jubilee. Every band rose to the challenge, with 44 recorded performances in the Branch.

Next year we will be ringing for the King's Coronation, and there is talk of a national recruitment campaign ahead of it, like the one running up to the centenary of the Armistice (and for the Millennium). High profile events can offer good publicity, but a healthy ringing community needs more than the occasional burst of recruitment. We should aim for a steady flow of new recruits – enough to grow our numbers and offset the inevitable losses as ringers age, but not too many at once to overload our ability to deliver quality training and good development opportunities. We have all lost ringers over the last couple of years so now is the time to try to set ourselves on an upward path.

Several towers are currently limited in what they can offer developing ringers without help, and would benefit greatly from one or two visitors a bit further on than they are. If you can spare the odd evening to help you would be made very welcome.

# ART, Teacher Training in the Branch

Following on from the success of the Sonning Deanery elementary ringers' outing I had to consider how to provide further progression opportunities.

What better way than to have Clare McArdle, ART Tutor and Birmingham Ringing School initiator come and run a teacher's training course for the Sonning Branch. I chose the Module 2 Foundation course, M2F, as this level advises on how to teach learners who have established bell handling to move on to develop skills for change ringing. It reduces the pressure on achieving by providing little progressive steps towards a larger goal. Or in the words of a learner "reduces the feeling of sheer panic!".

At this level there is so much to understand and experience, and often advanced bellringers don't realise how much they take for granted. Also, as we age, the ability to dual task let alone triple



task becomes harder. With 5 key foundation skills at this level there is much to cover from bell control, listening, rope sight, rhythm and striking and theory.

On Saturday 8th October the branch held the M2F course at St Mary's Twyford which is an excellent location with the church hall being adjacent to the door to the bell tower so no getting wet if it's raining. A large space

with lovely kitchen and servery which certainly made it easy to support a training course. Oh, and the tower can be silenced. Essential.

Ringers from 6 of our branch towers attended which was very encouraging. A few of the ringers had already attended the M1 Course, organised by the previous Training Officer Jacquie Hazell in 2018, so have been able to extend their knowledge of ART and hopefully they will trial new ideas in their future ringing practices.

A course in isolation is not always best, so ART provides a comprehensive website of information, toolbox of exercises along with mentors and then assessors when each teacher is ready for their accreditation to ART. Nigel and Jane Mellor will provide mentoring support to some of the ringers,

but other experienced ringers will mentor the teachers they attended with. This helps provide the continuity of the ART ideas.



It was an entertaining and informative day. The teachers enjoyed the camaraderie and being part of a group of people who all wanted to help others learn to ring. There were exercises to practice and exercises to create. Jan created her kaleidoscope Jan's Juggling and Daniel created his slow to quick Triple Kaleidoscope Challenge both to encourage bell control, teach the need to count and aid understanding of speeds. ART's toolkit of ideas provides resources like these for this level and explains why we should include them.

Following on from this course the elementary practices have been increased to twice a month to allow the teachers time to establish their teaching. If

you have learners in your tower, please consider sending them to the practices. Be in touch with Nigel Mellor Branch Ringing Master or Jane Mellor Training Officer.
